The Milwaukee Urban Water Trail builds on a series of efforts to bring life back to the rivers of the Milwaukee River Basin by improving access, water quality, fisheries, and wildlife habitat. The underlying goal of the Water Trail is to encourage people to enjoy their rivers in a responsible way that protects our natural and cultural resources. Water trail explorers are encouraged to respect these resources and the private landowners and communities that care for them.

ATURAL ATTRACTIONS

Our local rivers flow through lands that are both privately and publicly owned, with most of the latter protected by the Milwaukee County Parks system, by the Ozaukee County Park System, and other municipal parks. These parks provide a scenic backdrop along much of the water trail, as well as provide excellent opportunities for bird watching and wildlife viewing. It is common to see kingfishers, herons, egrets, mallards, osprey, eagles, and migratory birds, as well as the occasional river otter, beaver, mink, deer, coyote, turtle, and frog, among others. Due to improving water quality and river restoration projects such as the removal of 8 major dams and dozens of smaller barriers, over 40 species of fish can now be found throughout much of the water trail area. The DNR is reintroducing sturgeon, walleye, and other native fish that once thrived in our rivers, and fishing opportunities now abound, especially near Waubedonia County Park, and below Thiensville Dam and Fish Passage, Kletzsch Park Falls, and Estabrook Falls on the Milwaukee River and along the lower Menomonee River in Three Bridges Park. The water trail flows adjacent to the Ozaukee Interurban Trail, the Milwaukee County Parks' Oak Leaf Trail, and the Beer Line Trail, which provide quality hiking and biking opportunities that could be combined with a paddle trip. The Lake Michigan access sites allow paddlers to explore beaches, natural areas, and new parks along Southeast Wisconsin's beautiful lakefront in Milwaukee and Ozaukee County, while also providing a connection between river and lakefront access sites.

ULTURAL AND HISTORICAL ATTRACTIONS Although Milwaukee and its natural harbor began as a Great Lakes port in 1835, many settlers, fur traders, and immigrants were drawn to Milwaukee and other adjacent communities by the access

ILWAUKEE'S RIVERS – PAST AND PRESENT Milwaukee's rivers have always been important cultural, eco-

nomic, and natural pathways. Native Americans used these water routes for trade and transportation, and sustained themselves with the fish, wildlife, wild rice, and other plants harvested from the rivers and associated wetlands. Traders, trappers, missionaries, and French explorers used the rivers for exploration and trade. As European settlers moved into the Milwaukee area, the local rivers quickly became the main commercial and shipping arteries of the young community, and were heavily used for transporting wheat, lumber, coal, and other products. Over time, roads, railways, and air transport gradually replaced rivers as the major transportation routes for most goods. Milwaukee, Grafton, and other cities gradually turned their backs on the rivers, which had become severely polluted. Buildings that had once opened out to the river now looked to the streets.


Over recent decades, people are once again embracing their rivers. This change in perception is the result of improved water quality, a surge in building and redevelopment along riverfronts, increased interest in recreation, and improved public access. The rivers are now used largely for recreation — from the more natural reaches upstream meandering through parkland and natural areas enjoyed for their beauty and wildlife, to the more urban portions welcoming boaters to dock along the RiverWalk to enjoy a local beer, dinner, or entertainment. While Native Americans, traders, and trappers are rarely seen on our rivers today, modern day explorers can be found in canoes and kayaks seeking tranquility, relaxation, and a natural connection to the past in the midst of an increasingly busy world.

Water trails are liquid "pathways" that are being developed in communities across the country. They enable non-motorized boaters to find legal and safe access points, resting sites, and nearby cultural, historical, recreational, and natural attractions. Water trails connect people with places, both natural and human-made, connect past to present, and bring the boater into contact with the rivers, lakes, and provide "a sense of place" within our watersheds, promote stewardship, provide a unique perspective and vantage point, and bring us together as



Planning for a Safe Trip

Although the Milwaukee Urban Water Trail is not as remote as many popular water trail routes, the power and unpredictability of the Milwaukee, Menomonee, and Kinnickinnic Rivers and Cedar Creek should never be underestimated! It is important to plan ahead before launching. Be aware of water levels, potential hazards, and required and recommended portages before you head out!

Water Levels and Hazards Water levels and flow can vary greatly with rainfall, affecting safety both on the land and water. Higher water generally increases level of difficulty due to low bridges, snags, strainers (underwater trees), concealed boulders, low hanging trees, natural and

require portaging, including the Bridge Street Dam in Grafton, the Thiensville Dam, 4 dams along Cedar Creek, and the Estabrook Dam (slated for removal in 2018). In addition, several areas adjacent to historic dam removal sites, such as the former Chair Factory Dam, Waubeka Button Factory Dam, Saukville Dam, Lime Kiln Dam, and North Avenue Dam, can have big rapids and fast moving water that can be challenging for inexperienced paddlers.
